

Children attending Ireleth St Peter's CofE Primary (ISP) may need to stay at home due to local, regional or national restrictions linked to the COVID-19 pandemic. They may also need to stay at home because they are individually isolating or their class bubble has had to close. Our remote learning policy demonstrates that we aim to teach a broad and balanced curriculum as we would do in school. There may however, be some aspects of teaching and learning that have to be adapted.

Remote Learning

Maths including times tables

English including phonics or spellings

1 lesson linked to the Wider Curriculum alternating subjects

Remote Learning will predominantly take place via Class Dojo. Zoom will be used for weekly check ins. It will also be used as a teaching aid in Whale and Shark Class for English and Maths twice weekly.

- At the start of each week, a weekly overview will be shared with parent/carers.
- Work will be uploaded every morning by the Class Teacher and it is expected that these tasks will take no longer than 3 hours per day.
- Support aids and helpful websites will also accompany work.
- Work is differentiated for SEND and personalised work is set.
- Teachers and Teaching Assistants will be on hand during school hours to assist where necessary.
- Completed work should be uploaded by parent/carers onto Class Dojo for marking. This can take place daily or at the end of the week. Marking will be marked promptly with appropriate feedback and next steps.
- Class Dojo points will be awarded for good work.
- An 'End of the Week' post will be shared via Class Dojo on each class page.

Children are also encouraged to engage with activities that do not require the use of a screen such as baking, exercise, exploring outdoors and of course reading real books.

Vulnerable Pupils

The Headteacher and SENDCo will check in regularly with Vulnerable pupils. This will take place via Class Dojo message, email or a phone call. Weekly record sheets recording communication and any action needed will be kept and shared with relevant staff.

All staff are responsible for reporting concerns, including Safeguarding, to the Headteacher and/or DDSL

Vulnerable pupils will receive food packages on a weekly basis including over school holidays.

Vulnerable pupils will have access to a school laptop to ensure they can participate in remote learning.

Mental Health and Wellbeing

Mental Health and Wellbeing is viewed as a priority at ISP throughout this pandemic. As a school, we will be placing a higher emphasis on this during remote learning to ensure our families feel supported and can reach out if needed.

As a school we will implement the following:

- Weekly wellbeing competitions for the whole school
- Mindfulness activities
- Yoga demonstration videos
- A range of challenges linked to being outdoors
- Continue with our Star of the Week and Worker of the Month
- Whole school virtual theme events including 'Movie Night.'

The wellbeing of school staff is paramount. The Headteacher will check in regularly with all staff and offer additional support to those needing it. Staff are encouraged to have healthy work life balance. Wellbeing activities will be shared alongside special deliveries in the post!

Communication and Contact

Parents/Carers can expect regular communication from the Headteacher and School. Class Dojo will form the main pathway for communication alongside ParentMail for specific surveys.
